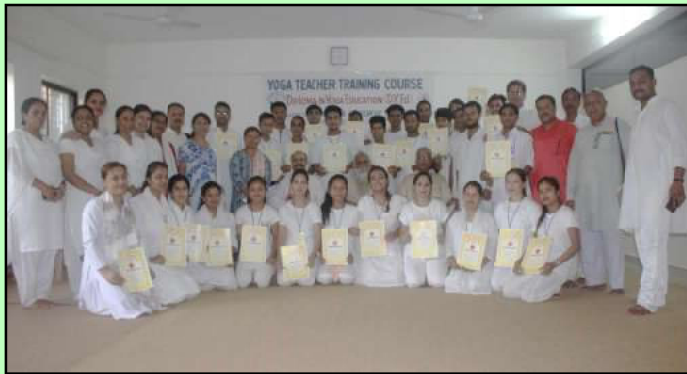


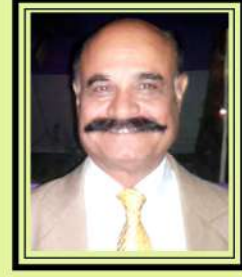

MESSAGE

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal (SBP) is a socio cultural voluntary organization affiliated to Rastriya Seva Bharati, New Delhi. SBP's benevolent works are spread across all the North-eastern states in general but it is more focused in Assam, Meghalaya and Nagaland at present. SBP was founded in 1998 in Guwahati, Assam by some eminent social workers from Assam, the main objective of SBP is to guide the youth to become a successful and patriotic citizen by providing moral orientation and skill development. SBP also provides hostel accommodation to the needy youths of the region. SBP is dedicated to the well-being of the society and has been working actively in the field of rural development, vocational training, health care, education and relief & rehabilitation during disasters, across all the states of Northeast India.

During the spread of Covid-19 pandemic SBP had distributed food & relief materials among the lockdown affected people regularly for a period of about 4 months in the state of Assam, Meghalaya & Arunachal Pradesh. It also distributed large quantity of cattle food among the cow keepers in an around Guwahati, Dalgaoon in Assam & in Khanapara & its adjoining areas in Meghalaya.

Over the past twenty-two years, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal has directly engaged itself in socio-cultural up-liftment of the region. During the recent horrendous flood that had shaken the state of Assam completely, SBP had conducted numbers of Medical Camps in the districts of Morigaon, Nalbari and Darrang in the state of Assam wherein thousands of flood victims were treated & free medicines were distributed. In this endeavour, National Medicos Organization (NMO) worked with

SBP as an associated agency. Besides the medical camps SBP also distributed food & drinking water to the flood victims.

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal had organised mass marriage program for the under-privileged couples. In this year, about 1078 such marriages were conducted in Morigaon district of Assam and six places (Naxalbari, Kumar Gram, Madarihat, Hasimara, Old Malda & Siliguri) in West Bengal.

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal also extends its charitable services in the far-flung areas of the NE regions through its affiliated service organizations (Seva Sangsthan) Namely:

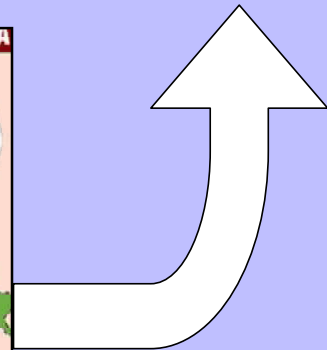
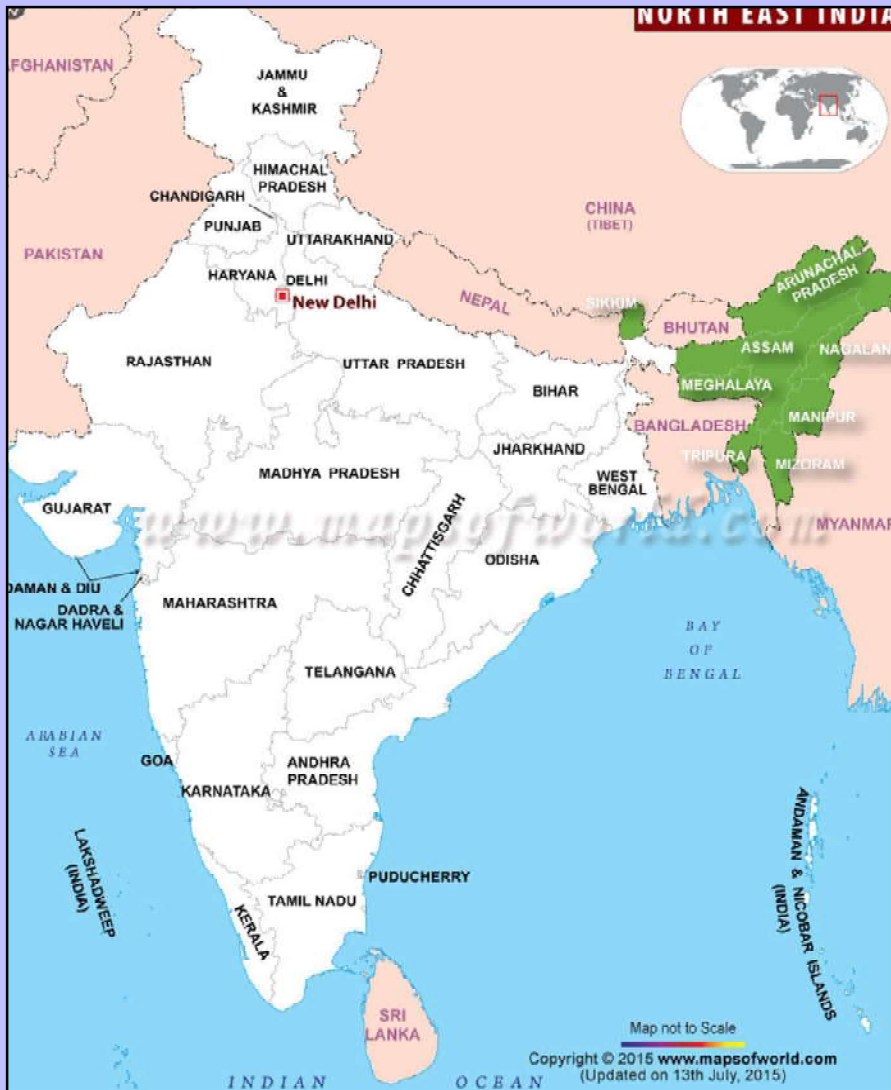

I. Health Care

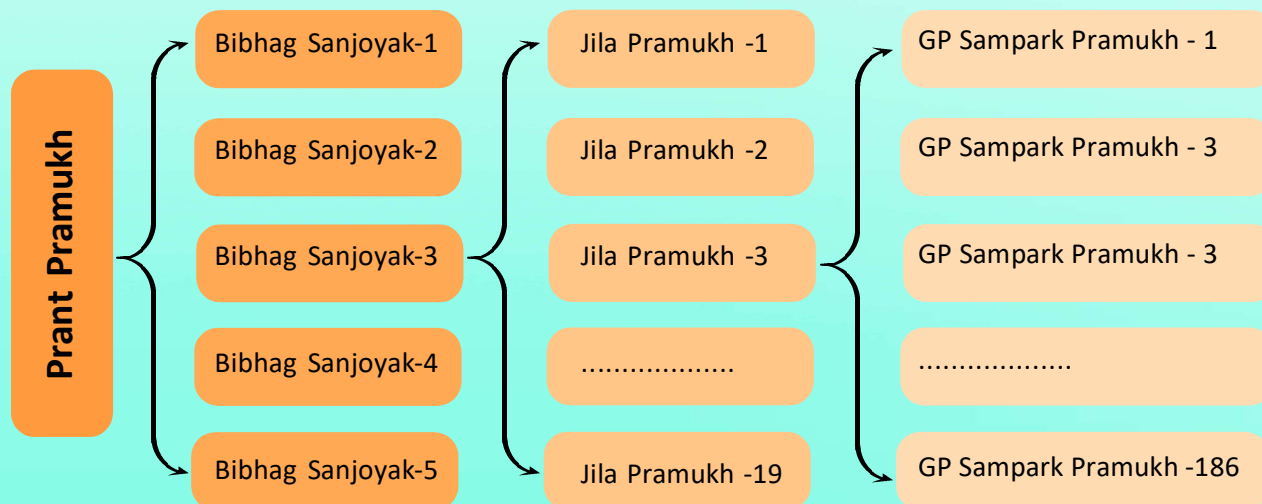
1 Arogya Mitra

Arogya Mitra (AM) Project is one of the most successful project of Seva Bharati, Purbanchal. It aims to reach the remotest villages to provide primary health care and awareness to the rural and downtrodden people of north eastern states. Under this project, an Arogya Mitra (Health worker) voluntarily provides free primary health care facilities for daily minimum one hour to the people of his or her locality. There are 3220 Arogya Mitras providing services in various places of north eastern states.

1.3. AROGYA MITRA PRIMARY TRAINING CAMP

Arogya Mitra Primary Training Camps are organized to train the selected local people of remote areas as a health worker. They are imparted trainings locality wise throughout the year by bringing them in a nearest place for a 7 days residential camp. Trainings are given on the health related topics such as anatomy, primary medicine, disease preventive measures, sanitation, hygiene, first aid, basic yoga etc. In the FY 2019-2020, 4 nos. of training camps were organized in different places of Assam, where 116 Arogya Mitra participated.

1.4. AROGYA MITRA PRAGATI VARG (Advance)

Arogya Mitra Pragati Varg is an advance training course for experienced Arogya Mitra who have a minimum experience of consulting 500 patients. Pragati Varg usually held at different places in every two years across northeast.

1.5. FREE MEDICAL CAMPS

Free medical camps are organized by Arogya Mitra in remote villages with the help of volunteer of SBP and doctors, medical college students and local persons. Through health check-up camps free medicines are given to the economically weaker and downtrodden sections of the society. This year, 32,450 patients were benefited in 295 free medical camps held in 25 different districts of Assam.

1.6. HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAMME

The health awareness programmes are organized by Arogya Mitra in different villages in all the north eastern states. In the programme, Arogya Mitra and invited health related resource persons discuss and interact with the villagers on health related matters for maintaining good health in the society. The awareness programmes also include sanitation and cleanliness topics for discussion especially on preventive measures for a healthy environment. This year, a total 271 health awareness camps were organized at different places across northeast where a total 4,753 patients were benefited.

1.7. AROGYAM

Arogyam is a health education and character building programme for the age group 4-14 years children. It is an one hour programme for one or two days in a week. The Arogyam is conducted by specially trained female Arogya Mitras in specific places through playing, singing, and storytelling. Presently, there are 10 Arogyam centres in interior locations of Assam.

1.7.1. KISHORI VIKAS

It is an one day monthly programme for teenage girls of villages organised by female Arogya Mitras to discuss various topics to maintain their health, education, character, security and other problems relating to their age group. Presently, 4 Kishori Vikas Kendras are running in different places of Assam.

1.7.2. MATRI MANDALI

Matri Mandali programmes organise to strengthen the adult women of the society. It is an one day monthly programme organised by mainly female Arogya Mitras to discuss the problems relating to child birth, child care, socio-economic development, sanitation, social awareness etc.





2 YOGA & NATUROPATHY

2.1. Yoga Education

Yoga is an integral part of health management practices of human life. It is a process of integrating physical, mental, ethical and intellectual state of a human being through its different process and practices so that he/she can live an all healthy life. With this aim, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal is promoting Yoga as one of its important activity. Seva Bharati, Purbanchal conducts Yoga Teacher Training Camps, Yoga Courses and Yoga & Naturopathy treatments through YOGNILAYAM, the Yoga and Naturopathy Institute and Yoga Centres situated at different places across all the north eastern states.

2.1.1. Yoga Teachers Training Camp/Course

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal conducts Yoga Teachers Training Programmes and Camps to promote Yoga awareness and practice among people of north eastern states through well trained Yoga teachers. For this purpose, SBP organises various courses and training on Yoga Education like Diploma in Yog Education (D.Y.Ed.), Yogic Treatment Training Course, 7 Days Yoga Shivar Course (Introductory), Visharad, Adhyapak courses etc.

2.1.4. YOGNILAYAM - The Yog and Naturopathy Institute

Yognilayam



Seva Bharati, Purbanchal established a Yog and Naturopathy Institute “YOGNILAYAM” at North Guwahati – a residential Yog Educational, Training and Naturopathy Treatment Centre with financial support from ONGC. It is well equipped with modern equipments, where qualified and experienced Yog teachers and Naturopathy doctors and experts render their services to train and treat the people. Yog education and training related courses such as Diploma in Yog Education (D.Y.Ed.), Yog and Naturopathy treatment Training Course, 7 Day Yog Shivir Course (Introductory) etc. are conducted in this institute.

The Yognilayam was inaugurated on January, 2019 in presence of chief guest Mananiya Shri Bhaiya-Ji Joshi, Sar-Karyabah, Rashtriya Swamesavak Sangh and Officials of ONGC, NE Zone along with other dignitaries and resource persons.

2.1.5. Yoga Center

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal is running 66 Yoga Centres at different places covering 21 districts of Assam. The Yoga centres facilitate regular practices of yoga to local people with Yogacharyas. In this year, a total 1705 people including children and women joined and benefitted from these Yoga Centres.

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal also have Block Level Yoga Centre in 17 development blocks covering 7 districts of Assam with the financial assistance from AYUSH Department, Government of Assam. Every Block Yoga Centres are conducting regular classes by engaging both male and female Yoga teachers by Seva Bharati, Purbanchal. The local people of blocks benefitted from this centre by participating in the Yoga classes.

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal is also running a Yoga Wellness Centre in Central Jail, Dibrugarh, Assam with the support of AYUSH Department, Assam.

2.2. YOGA THERAPY & NATUROPATHY TREATMENT

2.2.1. Yoga therapy

Yoga therapy is a type of therapy that uses yoga postures, breathing exercises, meditation and guided imagery to improve mental and physical health. The holistic focus of yoga therapy encourages the integration of mind, body, and spirit. Modern yoga therapy covers a broad range of therapeutic modalities, incorporating elements from both physical therapy and psychotherapy.

Different types of yoga therapy like, **Detoxification Therapy, Set Kriyas, Pranayam, Meditation, Mudras & Bandhas, Tratak, Mind Sound resonance technique (MSRT)**,



Instant relaxation technique (IRT), Quick relaxation technique (QRT), Deep relaxation technique (DRT), Sleep special technique etc. are given to the patients at Yognilayam, the Yoga & Naturopathy Institute by Seva Bharati, Purbanchal.

2.2.2. Naturopathic Treatment

Naturopathic Treatment is a science-based tradition that promotes wellness by identifying the unique aspects of each patient and then employing non-toxic natural therapies to restore his or her physiological, psychological, and structural balance.

Different types of Naturopathy treatment like, **Hydro Therapy, Spinal Bath, Spinal Spray, Hip Bath, Food & Arm Bath, Hot Foot Bath, Full Wet Sheet Peck, Banana leaf bath, Oil Massage, Powder Massage, Mud Therapy, Full Body Steam, Local Steam, Magneto therapy, Diet Therapy & Fasting, Gastro Hepatic Pack, Kidney Pack, Enema** etc. are given to patients suffering from various health issues like High blood pressure, Diabetics, Stress and other diseases at Yognilayam by Seva Bharati, Purbanchal.

3. FREE MOBILE PATHOLOGY TESTING UNIT

In view of required health facilities at remote villages of north-eastern states of India, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal launched a Free Mobile Pathology Laboratory Testing Unit to provide free sugar and haemoglobin testing in villages of north-eastern states. Mostly sugar and haemoglobin are tested through this unit. In this year, a total 884 people were tested their blood and most of them belongs to economically backward section of the society. Out of 884 people, 425 were tested with high sugar and 459 were tested low haemoglobin at 48 different villages in 6 districts of Assam.

4. DHANVANTARI SEVA YATRA

Dhanvantari Seva Yatra is a mega free health check up & treatment programme in entire north eastern states of India which is jointly organized by Seva Bharati, Purbanchal and National Medicos Organization (NMO) since 2005. In this programme, doctors and medical students comes from various medical colleges from all over the country and abroad and takes part in this novel venture voluntarily and impart their services to provide check up treatment & free medicine. Till now, 17 nos. of Dhanavanatari Seva Yatra (DSY) were successfully organized.

In this year, 17th DSY was organized at different places across northeast from 14th March to 21st March, 2020 with 34 doctors and 51 students came from various states of India like Bihar, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Manipur etc. and locally about 50 doctors & students along with volunteers participated in this Seva Yatra where 19,073 patient were benefitted in 67 different free medical camps.

After the campaign, participation certificate were given to the doctors and students.

5. NIRAMAYA

Niramaya Project- Integrated Child and Adolescent Development Action, an ambitious project was initiated in April, 2017 with the support from Infosys Foundation, which provides free health and education service facilities to the unreached section of the society to ensure practice of healthy lifestyle and treatment in 200 villages of Assam. Under Niramaya project, a total nos. of 200 villages were selected covering 18 districts of Assam.

Niramaya project aims to train young men and women from socially & economically backward section of the society so that they can train others for over all development of their areas. In this project, free health and education services are given to the children, young adults and women of economically underprivileged sections of the society to ensure healthy lifestyle practices.



5.1. Aim & Objectives of Niramaya

The aim and objectives of Niramaya project are:

- To establish, promote, support, assist, and conduct free health and education service facilities to the unreached section of the society.
- To ensure delivery of healthy lifestyle practice and treatment in an innovative manner.
- To build a development model primarily focusing on health and education, for children and adolescents in villages.
- To build a sustainable framework for community development by proper use of updated technology.
- To screen and identify health issues through medical camps in the communities.
- To raise awareness on health, skill development, livelihood, and social issues focusing mainly on mother and child's health.
- To improve life skills of children through character building, personality development and basic science concepts.
- To enhance physical and mental health of adolescents of the community through self-awareness program "Atmabhaan".

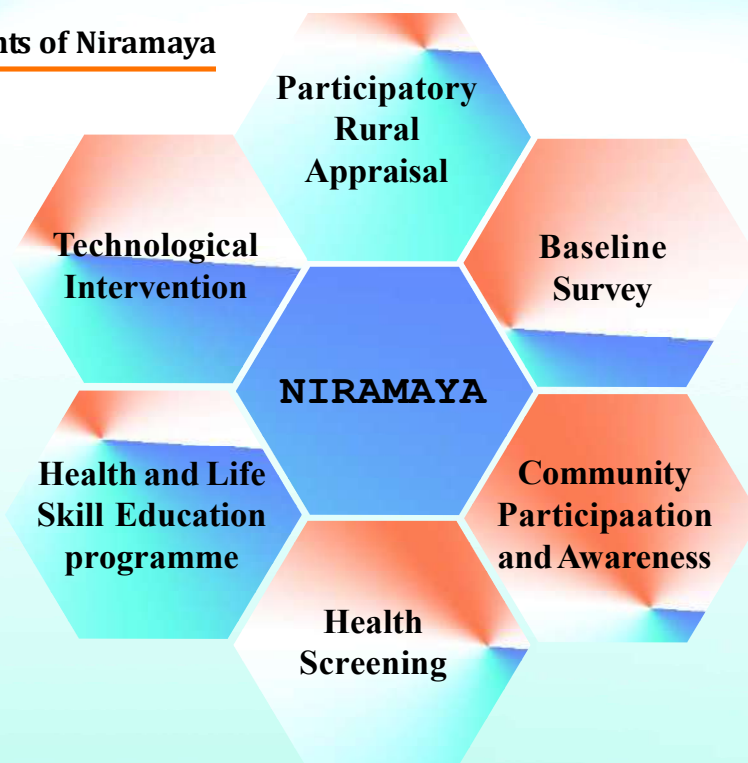


Figure 1: Six major components of Niramaya project.

5.3. Programmes under Niramaya project

- Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) of 200 Villages
- Baseline Household Survey of 200 Villages
- Health Screening Program for Children and Adolescents (0-18 yrs)
- Mother and Infant Health Program (0-5 yrs)
- Life Skill Development Program for Pre-teens (6-14 yrs)
- Adolescent Development/ Self-Awareness Program (15-18 yrs)

5.4. Niramaya Project Implementation & Management

To perform the project objectives, a team of dedicated 40 Community Field Officers (CFOs) who were previously engaged in Arogya Mitra project worked selflessly for social upliftment were engaged in this project. Each CFO is responsible for five villages. Besides, these CFOs, 600 village Assistants were also selected from villages for implementation of the Niramaya programmes. Three village volunteers were assigned in each village to run programmes smoothly.

In the FY 2017-2018 & FY 2018-2019, participatory rural appraisal (PRA), household survey and 1st phase of health screening and other programmes like health & life skill education programme, social awareness programmes etc. were done in all 200 villages using specially developed software. In this FY 2019-20, 2nd phase of health screening and other components were carried out along with training of trainers programmes in 200 villages.



5.5. Health Screening

In this FY 2019-2020, 2nd phase of health screening has been conducted in 200 villages of Assam. In this phase, a total 16,541 children were screened and 1444 children and adolescents were found defected. Out of total 16,541 children, 8020 children were male and 8521 children were female.

After screening, the required children were referred to nearby associated hospital or health centre for further treatment as per Govt. health schemes. One Central Govt. health scheme called Rastriya Baal Swatha Karyakram (RBSK) provides special treatment for defected children and adolescents. In this scheme, every Block Development Office (BDO) has a Mobile Doctors team who treats such type of defected children and adolescents. The assigned CFOs visited the Block Level RBSK offices and provided the list of identified special cases to the RBSK Officers for treatment and assigned Mobile Doctors team provided required treatment to that needy children and adolescents.



5.6. Mother and Child Health Development Programme (MCHP)

The mother and child health development programme (MCHP) was organized once in a month per village. The participants are mostly the mother of children and adolescents. In this year, a total 1109 programmes were held in 200 villages where a total 16910 mothers participated.

Figure 2: Total No. of participants in CDP (3-5 yrs)

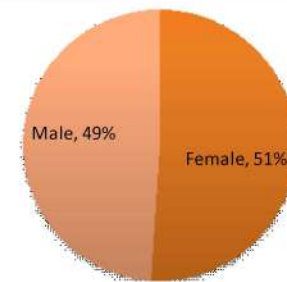


Figure 3: Percentage of male and female participants in CDP (3-5 yrs)

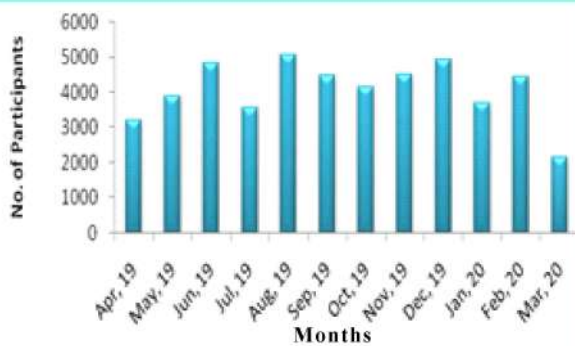


Figure 4: No. of male participants in CDP (3-5 yrs)

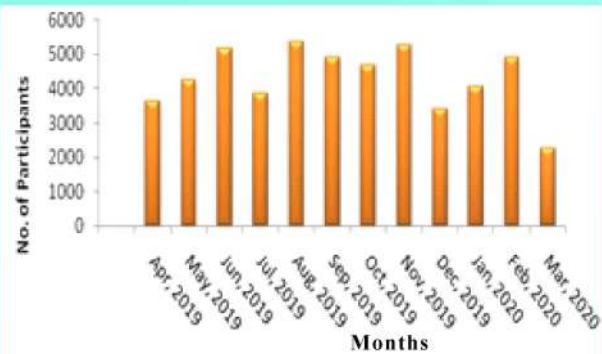


Figure 5: No. of female participants in CDP (3-5 yrs)

Childhood Development Programme (CDP) for 6-12 years age group

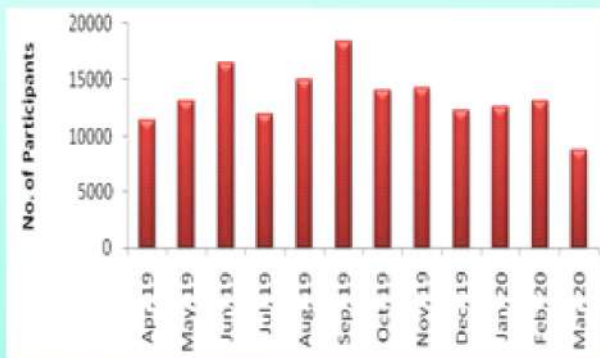


Figure : Total Number of participated in CDP (6-12 yrs)

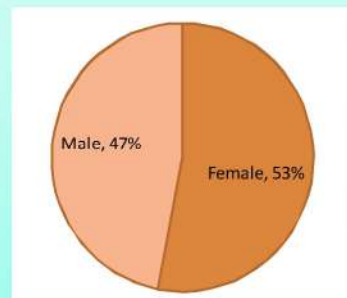


Figure : Percentage (%) of the male and female participants in CDP (6-12 yrs)



Figure 8: Number of male participants in CDP (6-12 yrs)

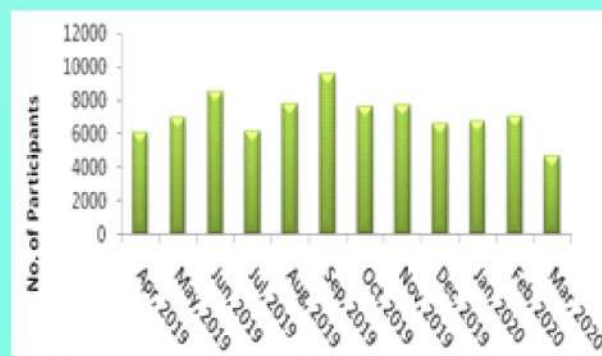


Figure 9: Number of female participants in CDP (6-12 yrs)

Fig 11: No. of the male participants in ADP (13-18 yrs)

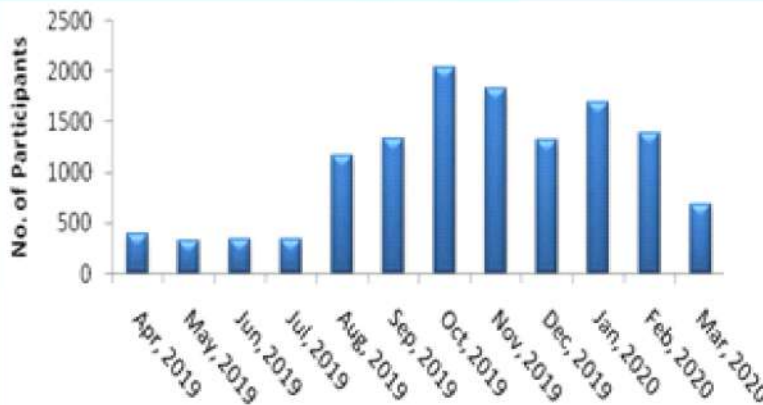
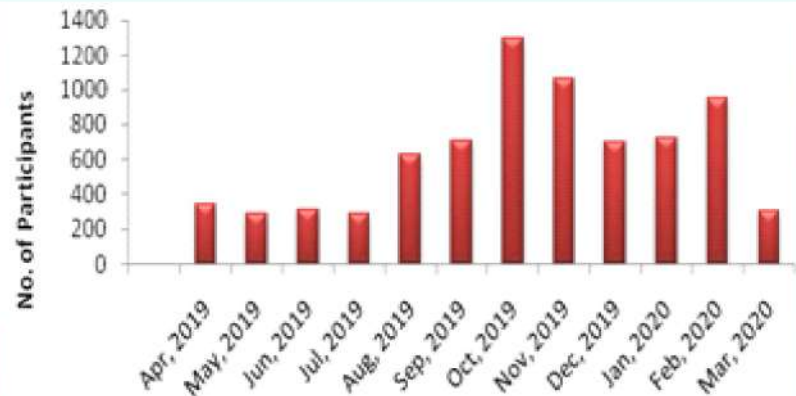
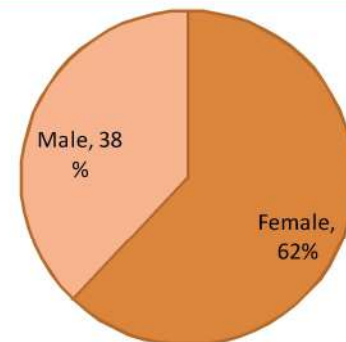


Fig 12: No. of the female participants in ADP (13-18 yrs)

II EDUCATION

6. One Teacher School

To empower children of rural areas of northeast India through education, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal initiated free study centre named One Teacher School (OTS) project for rural poor students under the guidance of Shri Surinder Sikand, Secretary, Sewa Canada International Aid Inc. The project sponsored and supported by Sewa Canada International Aid Inc. This project is for providing informal education to the children in the places of less schooling facility/ remote areas of northeast India to promote, support and grow awareness towards education among the students and parents. This is especially executed in tribal and tea garden areas of Assam. For that purpose Seva Bharati, Purbanchal started providing free classes by establishing Sanskar Kendras in three different areas namely Rani, Boko and Goalpara of Assam since 2011.

6.1. Objectives

- To provide basic facilities for study to the children.
- To provide education in rural places.
- To provide educational support to children of economically backward families.
- To develop self sustain education process in their own places.
- To provide character building based education.

6.2. Activities

Presently, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal is running 30 One Teacher Schools in Rani, Boko and Goalpara area of Assam where a total 785 students (on an average 26 students per school) enrolled in the year 2019-2020.

III. SKILL AND LIVELIHOOD DEVELOPMENT

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal working to generate livelihood option for villagers and poor people of rural area in Assam as well as in north eastern states. The livelihood option may generate more income opportunities for the families facing financial problems. Due to their financial obstacle, they are unable to avail good education, good health, sufficient daily home uses along other basic needs. Although the north eastern region has various livelihood opportunities but the region is facing problems of income generation from long back.

With the possibilities of livelihood options, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal initiated livelihood development programme. Under this programme, skill development workshops and trainings are conducted for better development processes. The livelihood and skill development programme also facilitates self-employment generation which may solve the basic problems facing by the downtrodden families of rural areas.

7. GRAM VIKAS YOJANA

Gram Vikash Yojana is a village development programme to transform a village into a self-dependent village by organizing various village level meetings, awareness and training programmes among the village people. The Seva Bharati, Purbanchal took various steps to make people self-reliable and sustainable in our traditional ways with modern technologies. For this purpose, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal set up four centres at four different places of Assam.

- Self-employment generation
- Social harmony programmes

Different types of products like Amrit Pani, Arka, Panchagabya, Dhanabati, Kamdhenu Keshkanti, Kamdhenu Malich Tel, BividhKable, Gou Mayadi Tel, Baalpaal Ros, Narisanjivoni, Arjunarist, Arjunaboti, Medoho Arka, Punanova Arka, Tulsi Arka, Purnanaba Arka, Giloi Arka, Hardechurna, DantaManjan etc. are produced from cow dung and urine for healthy treatment at Gram Vikash Centre and products are sold in nearby markets through this Centre.

In this year, three training programmes were organized at three different places in Assam through Gram Bikash Centre where a total 91 participants were trained.

8. Silai Prakalpa (Tailoring)

Silai and Hastakala is one of the good opportunities for livelihood to generate more income and create self-employment possibilities in north eastern states. For this purpose, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal organises Silai and Hastakala training programmes at various places in north eastern states. Trainings are mostly given to women to empower them and generate income source.

Activities under Silai Prakalpa are –

- Creating self-employment opportunities through Silai.
- Supporting Self Help Groups
- Supporting production centres etc.

Presently, four training centres are running for tailoring and embroidery throughout the north eastern region. In this year, 25 womens were trained in 3 different training camps in Assam.

13. SAMUHIK VIVAH

Seva Bharati, Purbanchal (SBP) organises Mass Marriages for the socially regressive population of our society who are willing to get marriage by observing all the rituals followed by their respective society but unable to do so due to pecuniary difficulties. SBP helped the individuals to maintain the social customs followed by their society and cultural values observed by their respective communities. Couples who remain unmarried due to social and financial difficulties, get immensely benefited out of the mass marriage program organized by SBP. In some areas, due to informal marriages, couples are not recognized by their society and they are not allowed to take part in any social and religious functions of their community. These couples are unable to arrange formal marriage due to their financial problem and remain same for a long time. All such couple gets immensely benefited because of the mass marriage program of SBP. The mass marriage program organized by SBP is helping the society to overcome the socio cultural issues besides financial difficulties. Through the mass marriage ceremonies, the needy couples get the opportunity to satisfy themselves as well as their society/community in observing the marriage rituals. The mass marriage ceremonies are conducted by SBP almost free of cost to needy couples. The ceremonies are held in traditional manner with Pandits chanting mantra for the bride and groom. SBP also offers gifts to the wedded couple which comprise a set of household utensil, a bag, an umbrella, cloths etc.

In this FY2019-2020, The mass marriage programme was held at Morigaon in Assam and at six places (Naxalbari, Kumar Gram, Madarihat, Siliguri, Hasimara & Old Malda) in West Bengal where a total 1078 couples got married. The bride and grooms were mostly belonging to Tea Tribe, Mising, Koch, Rabha, Boro, Ahom, Dewri Community along with other communities. The entire mass marriage event started with an inauguration programme, in presence of dignitaries and guest. They had spoken to the participants on need of social marriage and restoration of cultural values. They also talk on the role of organizations to success those programmes.

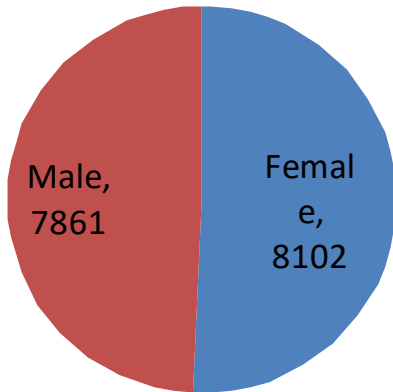

V. Relief Work

19. Relief Work in flood affected areas of Assam

The state of Assam is very prone to annual flooding because of its tropical monsoon climate. Every year, flood causes recurring destruction of infrastructure, crops, livelihoods and loss of lives. In 2019, flooding and subsequent landslides have widely damaged the houses, farm lands, schools, bridges and road links across Assam. Lakhs of people have been affected and thousands of families were forced to take shelter on schools, highways and temporary relief camps.

Responding to the crisis, volunteers of Seva Bharati, Purbanchal have been engaged in extensive relief work in 17 flood affected districts of Assam. Seva Bharati, Purbanchal reached out to provide food, drinking water, clothes and medical assistance to the flood affected people in the worst-affected areas. Prepared foods were distributed to the affected people at Chamta, Nalbari district. Bleaching and phenyl were also distributed at many flood affected places.

After flood, several free medical camps were organized for the flood affected people in Nalbari, Morogaon and Darrang district of Assam.



20. Relief Work during Curfew in Guwahati City

Hundreds of passengers stranded at the Guwahati railway station in the midst of protest against the Citizenship Amendment Bill in December, 2019 due to indefinite curfew and Internet clampdown in Guwahati city. In that situation, Seva Bharati, Purbanchal distributed prepared food to 3000 passengers stuck at the station in three days.

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Free meals distributed among stranded train passengers

GUWAHATI, Dec 14: Rashtra Sevika Samiti and Harekrishna Movement, Guwahati jointly distributed free meals today to the stranded train passengers at the Guwahati Railway Station as many trains were cancelled due to the anti-CAB (Act) protests.

One of the distributors said, "Around 3,000 people were provided light food from 1 pm today. Thousands of people have been stranded at the station for the last five days. It is becoming difficult for them to get food at normal prices. Prices of all commodities have shot up due to insufficient stocks. We will provide free meals tomorrow as well if the train services are not restored."

Train services in the region have been out of gear since December 10 on account of

the protests. The Northeast Frontier Railway said most of the long-distance trains are plying to and from Guwahati. Some passenger trains to Bar-

ak Valley and Agartala in Tripura are also plying.

"Around 24 short-distance passenger trains to and from Guwahati have remained can-

celled till date. A special train was plying to Dimapur from Guwahati on Saturday to ferry the stranded people, mostly students," an NFR official said.
