1. About Seva Bharati Manipur

Seva Bharati Manipur was established in the year 1985 by people from various walks of life consisting social workers, professionals, businessman etc. It is registered under Registrar of Societies Act XXI of 1860 at the office of Registrar of Societies, Lamphelpat, Imphal. It is s also registered under section 12AA of Income Tax Act 1961, which is commonly kown as 12-A of Income Tax. Its registration number is 673/12A/CA/87088/573 dated 02-12-1987. It has been renewed with Unique Registration No.AABTS8894FE198701, dated: 24-09-2021. It registered with 80G also, whose renewed Unique Registration Number is is AABTS8894F20103, dated: 02-10-2021. Accounts of Seva Bharati Manipur are audited annually by a Charted Accountant (M/S KUNJABI &Co.) and Filing of Income Tax are also done within the stipulated time. Its objective is clearly mentioned in the Memorandum of Seva Bharati Manipur. It may also be mentioned that Bye-Law of Seva Bharati was amended in the year 2013 as per the instruction/ guidelines of the government of Manipur. Day today affairs of Seva Bharati Manipur is managed by a 'Managing Committee" consisting of seven members namely, President, Vice President, Secretary, Joint Secretary, Treasurer and two members. Last election held for the office bearers of Seva Bharati was on 07-11-2020 and it is for three years.

4. COVID-19

4.1 COVID-19 Awareness

We are all aware that COVID-19 pandemic started spreading throughout the word since December, 2019. Initially it started from China. In India it started spreading from around February 2020. Seva Bharati with its dedicated volunteers took up Manipur various initiative not to spread Novel CORNA VISRUS. As per the ICMR and WHO guidelines, people should not go out unless very necessary. People should wear face mask and sanitise hands frequently with social distancing (6 ft). Doctors and paramedics should wear PPE etc while giving treatment. Seva Bharati Manipur organised awareness programme to effect these measures. They were also given instruction not to be afraid of the pandemic. They should stay aware of various guidelines issued by government from time to time.



4.2 Covid-19 Relief

Seva Bharati Manipur with its dedicated volunteers reached out to the people for distribution of face mask and hand sanitisers in large number. Volunteers visited door to door making awareness as well distribution of items. When Government issued Lock Down in March 2020 for 21 days, a complete ban of movement of people to contain spread of COVID-19. It caused panic to many people , especially daily wage earners. They did not have food to eat. Many did not have space to stay and cook. A horrible situation. During such time, volunteers of Seva Bharati Manipur with financial assistance from Rashtriya Seva Bharati Delhi and generous donors from local people of provided grocery items such rice, dal, oil and onion etc. Seva Bharati reached out to stranded people such as tourist, hostel boys and girls during the first phase of COVID-19. Beneficiaries appreciated the noble work of Seva Bharati Manipur. Large number of volunteer came out to to extend help during the COVID-19 pandemic.



During the II phase of Pandemic (COVID-19), patients and hospitals were panic for not having sufficient Oxygen which is required in large quantity in very short time. Situation was so serious that Government of India introduced Oxygen Train for supply of Oxygen to the needy state across the country. At such time Seva Bharati Manipur with help of Seva International and also with Seva Canada, provided 110 Oxygen concentrators to 11 hospital. Some Concentrators were loaned to home quarantine patients, which is again taken back for loaning to other such patients. AYUSH-63 was again a phase for distribution to home quarantine patients. The schem was taken up with the help of Ministry of AYUSH, Govt of India. Seva Bharati extended its COVID-19 relief service to the neighbouring country , Myanmar. Blood donation camp were also organised during such dreaded time at RIMS-Imphal and JNIMS Imphal Blood donation camp was organised jointly with NMO Manipur. Large number Arogya Kit were also distributed to the people flung area whose health care facility is less compared to urban area. Arogya Kit were provided by Seva International.

5. Neurotherapy

Neurotherapy is a system of physiotherapy by messaging the body either by legs or hands. It can cure many diseases which without medicine. Chronic diseases are also treated by this method. It is a continuous activity of Seva Bharati Manipur for the last many years. Success rate of treatment is growing. Treatment is without medicine i.e by messaging the body parts by trained therapist. At present therapy is going on at Seva Bharati Manipur, Nagamapal Imphal premise every day from 6:30 - 10:00 am on all working days except Sunay. All kinds of patients are treated here.





6. Go-Sala

A go-shala has been set up at Rajarshi Bhagyachandra skill development Centre (RBSDC), Haraorou. At present 10 cows are being kept. Training on cow based farming, preparation of compost are being organised regularly. Around 100 villagers have been benfitted for rearing local cow for treatment of common diseases, as pesticide, for organic manure and organic farming. It has also become a Promotional Unit for Go-Sala.



7. HANDLOOM DEVELOPMENT

Seva Bharati set up a Handloom Unit at Rajarshi Bhagyachandra skill development Centre (RBSDC), Haraorou. Formal inauguration was done Hon'ble Industry Misnistry Shri Thongam Bishwajit Singh in the presence of Shri Ulhas Kulkarniji, Assam Kshetra Pracharak, Ma. Prant Sanghachalak , Dr L. Ibungohal Singh and Shri Aribam Brajakumar Sharma, President Seva Bharati. Ten numbers of loom has been set up and engaged 15 local weavers for the activities, i.e training cum production. Seven more centre have been set up namely at Ghari, Ningthoukhong, Khundrakpam, Pukhao, Maiba Khul, Keithel Manbi, Hiyanglam. Total number of looms are 50.





8. FREE MEDICAL CAMP

Dhanvantary Seva Yatra (free medical camp) were held wef 7-13 February 2021 at six places. They are Charangpat, Irang of Kangpokpi district, Serou of Kakching district, Thanga & Karand and Leimaram of Bishnupur district, Yambem and Andro of Imphal East district. 1175 patients were treated during the Dhanvantary Seva Yatra by a team of 63 doctros and paramedics. Helth checkups were also done for Blood Sugar, HB, ECG and eye check etc. B.P-11 Nos., HB-129, ECG-210, Eye Check up-52. Free medicines were also distributed to the patients.







9. YOGASAN

Yogasan is one of the main activities of Seva Bharati Manipur. Due to COVID-19 pandemic, most of the yoga programme were done through Online. It could connect more places due to online. New practitioners did join yoga programme though COVID online counselling, which was operational to relief people from COVID-19 pressure. Though physical yoga vould not be performed properly, online yoga performed successfully in many place.

10. AGRICULTURE

Seva Bharati Manipur organised training for the organic farming as well as idea of composite agriculture to double income to the local farmers with the help of CAU, A Central Govt University. Composite farming is also done at Rajarsi Bhagyachandra Skill Development Centre, Haraorou, which is a component of Seva Bharati Manipur.An Orchid Yard is also developed with the assistance of IBSD, which is a research unit of local plant varieties under Government of India. Local people are encouraged to see the model farming so that they can set up to increase income.







11. NCPCR

National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), New Delhi sanctioned Twelve (12) programmes to Seva Bharati Manipur during the period of 2019-2020. The programmes were conducted successfully by the dedicated team of Seva Bharati within a short span of thirty (30) days i.e., 16^{th} December, $2019 - 14^{th}$ January, 2020. There were seven (07) state level programmes and five (05) district level programme. The district covered are (i) Churachandpur; (ii) Bishnupur; (iii) Chandel; (iv) Imphal West and (v) Imphal East.
